Assistant, Associate or Full Professor

The Department is seeking candidates with expertise in Nuclear Medicine with an interest in clinical service and teaching of medical students, fellows and residents.

UC San Diego's Department of Radiology is one of the most innovative and productive academic departments in the country, offering state-of-the-art services for clinical and translational studies. The Department of Radiology performs more than 400,000 examinations per year and has approximately 150 full-time and part-time faculty. The department has active multidisciplinary collaboration with other departments to perform the best patient care.

The successful candidates will be responsible for providing high quality training and teaching, the clinical care of patients and/or translational research. Protected research time and research support may be available.

Candidates must have a MD, DO or equivalent. Candidates must be Board certified or Board eligible in Diagnostic Radiology (American Board of Radiology) and/or Nuclear Medicine (American Board of Nuclear Medicine). Candidates must have or be eligible for a California medical license or equivalent certification/permit as determined by the Medical Board of California.

Candidates must be eligible to hold UC San Diego Physician and Surgeon Medical Group membership at the time of the appointment start date.

Candidates who have completed at least a 1-year Nuclear Medicine fellowship with expertise in cross-sectional imaging are preferred.
